The Redemptorist Retreat Center is located on the outskirts of Oconomowoc, Wisconsin on beautiful Crooked Lake. Tucked in the rolling, wooded hills of the Kettle Moraine region of Wisconsin, the Center is south of Interstate 94 in Oconomowoc. It is a short 35-minute drive from Milwaukee, approximately one hour from Madison, and two hours and fifteen minutes north-west of downtown Chicago.



Directions

Arriving from the WEST on I-94, exit mile marker 282, (Oconomowoc). Turn right at the top of the ramp onto Hwy 67 south. At the intersection of Hwy 67 and Delafield Rd (DR), turn left onto Delafield Road. North Timber Trail Lane is located approximately one half mile on the right. The Center is located at the end of Timber Trail Lane.

Arriving from the EAST on I-94, exit mile marker 282 (Oconomowoc). Turn left at the top of the ramp onto Hwy 67 south. At the intersection of Hwy 67 and Delafield Rd (DR), turn left onto Delafield Road. North Timber Trail Lane is located approximately one half mile on the right. The Center is located at the end of Timber Trail Lane.
